Another year, and another period of growth, change, and learning for Move The World. When I look back and think about the small volunteer-run organisation we were a few years ago, I think wow, look at us now. We have paid employees, a professionalised Board of Trustees, a registered partner entity in Ghana, and funding partners we could have only dreamt of two years ago. All of these are intensely dedicated to the amazing work that our facilitators are doing delivering our exciting, relevant, and meaningful programmes to hundreds of young people in Ghana.

This year has presented further challenges to us all. Not just our continued struggle with the COVID-19 pandemic, but increasing environmental pressures, scary rates of inflation, and a mental health crisis, with anxiety and depression increasing by a massive 25% globally. Not to mention the wars, overthrown governments, over-turned Supreme Court rulings and an ongoing refugee crisis.

This is why our programmes feel more relevant than ever. The importance of supporting the development of a generation of informed, inspired and critical thinking young people is paramount to our ability to address challenges we face personally, locally and globally. We play just a small part in this process, but an important one for those we impact, our students, teachers, facilitators and team members.

It has been 10 years since I started the journey that has become the charity we are today. And it is with this milestone, amidst other personal life changes demanding of my time (2 small children), that I have made the difficult decision to step down from my role as Chair of Trustees at the end of 2022. Whilst sad at the thought of not being so closely connected to the team and the work after so long, it feels right for me and an opportunity for Move The World to move into it's next chapter. I will remain an avid supporter, and am confident in all the amazing people that will be leading this organisation going forwards.

Our success and growth this year is down to our unwavering sense of family that exists across everyone involved and our belief in the purpose of our work. I thank you all.

This year has continued to push us individually and as an organisation. We have seen our programmes expand into new schools and most notably we have seen the design and implementation of our newest follow on programme, Get Local.

Get Local allows students to continue their journey as global citizens by introducing them to SDG's 7-12 in their Form 1 year of education. It engages students to see their potential as individuals and how they can tackle challenges in their own communities.

It hasn't all been easy- facilitators faced a new challenge working with teenagers and the concepts brought up more ideas and questions. But the one thing that MTW consistently comes back to is the ability to keep forging through uncertainty.

The last few years the charity sector has taken a hit, and MTW is no exception. However, we have used this challenge to push ourselves out of our comfort zone and into something that is unknown but exciting. We were able to bring on a grants manager this past year which started to put us on the map with trusts and foundations and allowed us to increase and diversify our income sources. We were able to train new facilitators and develop our team to reach more students and schools than ever before. We were able to think strategically about our next steps and how we could best move forward and most importantly we were able to work together a team to ensure the greatest quality is delivered.

"Sailboat not a speedboat" has been our company motto since the beginning and looking into the future it continues to drive us. This coming year we are looking to steady the ship, ensure that the 33 programmes a year we run do so effectively and efficiently.

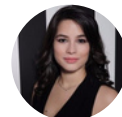
- **Grant Income** - Having had very little success with grants before we have hit a home-run this year with grants totalling £9,000 from Ashworth Charitable Trust, Souter Charitable Trust and Ghana International Foundation!

- **April 2022** - International Women's Day launches in March each year and continuing with our annual kickoff event last year, we continued to build on a successful online event and invite another fantastic panel to speak and discuss the theme of #BreakTheBias.

Partnerships & Collaborations

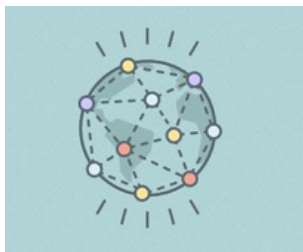
There is no "I" in Team - we are ever grateful for our collaborations

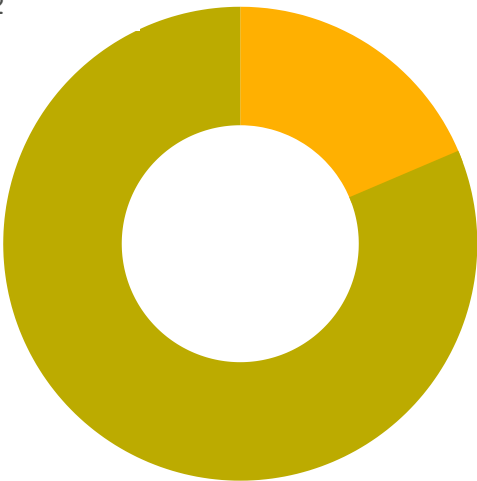
