Those two programmes turned into 52 programmes this year; reaching 1350 students throughout the Ga West Region in Ghana. This coming year, 2023, will continue to see this number increase as our impact grows and reaches more young people.

This year has seen some big changes, most notably with Megan stepping back from the charity after 10 years. She has been influential in our journey thus far and we know she will continue to be an integral part of our community and family.

We regularly joke that no one can leave MTW completely and so far its been true!

The charity sector as a whole continues to take hits both financially and through individual engagement, however we are so proud of our amazing team who have continued to push, strive for more and get comfortable in the uncomfortable. A team that pushes so hard that we are honoured to announce that we received a generous donation from Ghana International Foundation, landed our first multi-year grant from Global Fund for Children and begun conversations with our second corporate partner, Pearlstone Alternatives.

### May Wave Programmes

Within the process of moving our financial year to match the academic year of Ghana - January to December, this annual report is only reporting on 8 months but we have continued to build out programmes and keep ourselves busy!

With a total of 11 programmes (5 Get Global & 6 Get Local) on the go, we actively engaged with 436 students, employing 11 facilitators and continuing to build partnerships and collaborations within the community.

We are proud to announce that **41%** of our students showed an increased ability in their critical thinking capabilities and **62%** increased their SDG knowledge and understanding.

Our newly trained facilitators began their first programmes as lead facilitators and rose to the challenge with diligence and expertise thanks to the months of shadowing from our long-term facilitators.


# 2023 - Steadying our Sailboat


